# Friends of Coronado State Historic Site 2018 Accomplishments

The 400-member strong **Friends of Coronado State Historic Site (FCHS) provides financial support, volunteers, and advocacy for the Coronado and Jemez State Historic Sites.** A dedicated, dynamic, and fun organization, the FCHS is widely seen as the most successful friends group supporting New Mexico Cultural Affairs, Historic Sites Division.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- **Volunteerism**: Donated more than 11,000 volunteer labor hours in 2018, valued at over \$271,000.
- Fundraising: Raised over \$87,000 (before expenses) in support of the Coronado and Jemez Historic Sites.
- Art Auction: Conducted our first annual all-New Mexico Art Auction, raising more than \$5,700.
- **Total financial support**: Donated or pledged over \$17,300 to support both Historic Sites.
- Coronado Historic Site support: Invested over \$3,585 towards ongoing preservation of Painted Kiva, \$3,375 in site repairs/maintenance, and \$450 in new museum exhibits.
- Scholarships: Awarded two \$1,500 scholarships to University of New Mexico graduate students for doctoral research that will answer questions about life in Rio Grande pueblos.
- Events support: Hosted 13th Annual Fiesta of Cultures (Coronado) over 600 attendees, raffle raised over \$1,000. Hosted Reggae by the River concert (Coronado) over 600 visitors. Supported Light Among the Ruins (Jemez) 4,000 attendees; event raised over \$23,500.
- National award: The Coronado Historic Site/FCHS received a prestigious Award of Merit from the American Association for State and Local History for the 2017 Dig Kuaua community archaeology project. Dig Kuaua involved 75 local volunteers and attracted over 1,100 visitors, US and foreign.
- Member benefits: Hosted eight lectures on New Mexico history and prehistory with total attendance over 440; conducted seven educational outings and six hikes.
